School is the sacrosanct Institution, a place of learning and moulding a child in his formative years. Rightfully called the second home of the child, it not only imparts knowledge, but also helps them realise the non-scholastic goals in order to ensure their entry into pioneer colleges thereafter.

However, over the years, teachers have noticed a shift in the mindset of the parents. They have become immensely achievement oriented, so much so that education has become a mere game of numbers. This has terribly hampered pupils, who are not growing up with the usual encounters with both success and failure as they tread through the processes of trial and error. This has really caused an increase of achievement oriented anxiety in the children. Wards have become fragile in the sense that they are not able to take failure in their stride. For example, not getting a substantial role in the school play or not being able to make it to the school sports team have led to intense peer brawl.

Although an educationist or a teacher is not a qualified psychologist, but through majority of their observations, they are unanimously of the opinion that children are gradually and increasingly regressing and becoming individuals who are far from being resilient in their approach towards life. Therefore, teachers feel it is incumbent for parents to stop protecting their children from life's vicissitudes and allow them to experience sorrow as well as disappointments, failures as well as setbacks.

Children do not need to be praised all the time thereby protecting them and sheltering them. This would cause them to lead a life, divorced from reality, as if, surrounded in a cocoon. They must be allowed to taste reality, whereby parents can always be by their side, like a strong anchor, lending them with the requisite support. Thus teachers must be given a free hand and the licence to be able to scold the pupil without being worried of being blamed for undermining and discouraging him. The scenario, sadly, is very different in today's day and age. A very common incident today is, a remark made by a teacher, instead of being interpreted for the child's well-being, has now supposedly become the cause for a child to "go and do something terrible", which is taking their own lives, over quite a trivial matter.

In fact, it has become a matter of convenience to blame the school, should anything go wrong. The "system" is more often than not, frivolously blamed and solely made responsible for juvenile depression, anxiety, exam-related panic attacks, snooty behaviour of peers, strict approach of teachers, too many tests or too less tests and so and so forth. Children are unnecessarily overprotected by their parents. It has reached this extent that parents are often found discussing the delicate state of mental health of their children with the school authorities. This is doing more harm than good in the long run.

Unequivocally it can be said that school and teachers are concerned with the growth, knowledge and comfort of the child, just as the parents of the wards are. Parents must trust the school and its teachers in their wholehearted efforts in pursuing to bring up each and every pupil as a robust and resilient child, mature and strong adult who learns to play fair, accept defeat manfully and to win gracefully.


After days of search for the resources, we finally went on for further work. It felt very official for us to make the magazine for the school. It made our vision more specific as to what is required for the magazine.
