

MESSAGE FROM THE HEADMASTER



Dear Parents/Guardians

Successful schools begin by engaging students and making sure they come to school regularly. Attending school regularly is important for your child's future. For example, children who miss school frequently lag behind in their work and do not fair as well as others in the exams. Any absence, whether excused or not, deprive students the opportunity to learn in accordance with the school's instructional programme. For, students who miss school are sometimes further excluded from learning opportunities as a consequence of chronic absenteeism. The attendance rate is important because students are more likely to succeed in academics when they attend school consistently. It's difficult for the teacher and the class to build their skills and progress if a large number of students are frequently absent. A prerequisite to success in any endeavour is "showing up" - by being present, and classes are no exception. If you're not showing up in class, you're forfeiting every opportunity provided to you in the classroom. It is the parents' legal responsibility to ensure their children receive appropriate education. Failing to send your child to school regularly without good reason is an offence.

Absence disrupts the education of the individual pupil and the whole class. The total number of working days is approximately 225. Students must obtain 75% / 80% as applicable. Hence 20 % leeway is given to cover family emergencies, or any medical appointments. It is understandable that, you may have to miss a class due to illness or an important obligation. However, this should be a very rare occurrence.

At one end this year we have 27 students achieving 100% attendance and on the other hand we have a significant number of students not achieving the minimum attendance. A complete chart is given in the magazine. Please remember that parental illness, going shopping, visiting family, truancy, not wanting to go to school are not acceptable reasons to be absent. It is the duty of the parents to inculcate the importance of attending school and it's related activities regularly. Before or after the vacation full day attendance is compulsory for all the students. It is the onus of the parents to ensure that there is no lapse in the rules laid down by the school and guardians are requested to abide by them. The children should not take shelter in flimsy excuses as the school already covers the genuine reasons for absence.

The holiday list for the next session is finalised in the month of December which gives enough time for the parents to chalk out their family outings and other religious ceremonies. In spite of the holiday list many parents defy the rules laid down by the school and are not worried about their ward's attendance. The school diary clearly states the rules for 'Leave and Absence' in Page 64 Para 2 and 8. It is my humble request to read the rules and abide by it for the betterment of your ward. School vacations are periods of absence of students catered for in the learning teaching process and completing the laid down curriculum. However extending the same by absenting just before or joining late after the vacation date is not only detrimental to the education of your child but also disrupts the discipline of the school. School instructions in this regard are given on Page 76-77 of the school diary. All parents are requested to please adhere to the same. It is very embarrassing when the parents bring religion and related excuses in availing an extended vacation of their child.

The school is a temple of learning and the teachers are The Guru's- the dispenser of knowledge. This is the faith in which the students are brought up in India. Attending School regularly gives us a clearer perspective and a sense of purpose and peace. As we stride towards the school we will be able to bear every trial and tribulations with the able guidance of one who has taken this honourable profession. The school provides purpose to our lives. It is a beacon of light that leads us onto the right path.





TO A BUTTERFLY


Stay near me – do not take the flight!

FATE OF LOSING VALUES TODAY


